- WHEREAS: The Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians (GTB) is a political successor to signatories of the March 28, 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) in which GTB and other Ottawa and Chippewa tribes ceded to the United States much of the land that became the State of Michigan; and
- WHEREAS: GTB reserved by Article XIII of the March 28, 1836 Treaty of Washington the rights of its members to hunt and fish in the 1836 Treaty Ceded Territory; and
- WHEREAS: GTB re-affirmed its government-to-government relationship with the United States, becoming formally acknowledged as a federally recognized Indian Tribe effective May 27, 1980 (see 45 Fed. Reg. 18321-322 (March 25, 1980); and
- WHEREAS: GTB is organized under a Tribal Constitution approved by the Secretary of the Interior on March 29, 1988; and
- WHEREAS: Article IV, section (l)(a) of the GTB Constitution vests in the Tribal Council the power "[t]o promote and protect the health, education, and general welfare of the Band and its members"; and
- WHEREAS: GTB has elected a full governmental Tribal Council consisting of, Thurlow "Sam" McClellan, Tribal Chairman; Kimberly M. Vargo, Vice Chair, Jane A. Rohl, Secretary; David Arroyo, Treasurer; Mark L. Wilson, Councilor; Percy Bird, Jr., Councilor; and Thomas P. Shomin, Councilor; and
- WHEREAS: GTB, in honor of its traditional, cultural heritage places a high priority on the preservation and responsible use of its natural resources in the 1836 Treaty Ceded Territory; and
- WHEREAS: The Tribal Council, in awareness of the human, industrial, and commercial impact on the environment, realizes the significant role of protecting the forest, wildlife, fisheries, and water resources for the cultural, spiritual, and continued exercise of Treaty Reserved Rights under the terms of the Consent Decree entered in *United States v. Michigan*, W.D. Mich. Case No. 2:73-cv-26, in 2007; and

- WHEREAS: The Treaty Reserved Rights extend throughout the basins that contain Lakes Huron, Michigan, and Superior; and
- WHEREAS: The Boardman (Ottaway) River is located in the Grand Traverse region of Michigan, which is within the 1836 Ceded Territory; and
- WHEREAS: There are four dams located on the Boardman (Ottaway) River: 1) Brown Bridge Dam- Built in 1921 and removal completed in 2013; 2) Boardman Dam Built in 1894 and rebuilt in 1930 breached in 2017; 3) Sabin Dam Built in 1902 rebuilt in 1930; and 4) Union Street Dam built in 1867; and
- WHEREAS: Scientific literature, peer-review publications, and tribally-, state-, and federally-authored technical reports overwhelmingly implicate dams as a primary impediment to the reproduction and recovery of native fish populations including lake sturgeon; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians supports bi-directional fish passage across man-made barriers of only fish species native to the Lake Huron, Michigan, and Superior basins.
